Draw yourself to the best of your ability before we learn how to do it in class. Think of this as a pretest. It will be fun to go back and compare after we have learned correct proportions.






Sketchbook 2: Face Packet

Create a drawing that tells a story.








Sketchbook 6: Persuasive Poster Design

In this sketch you will need to take two unrelated items and morph them into one. You can show the progression of the morph in stages or draw it in mid morph.







Sketchbook 9: Crushed Can Drawing

Sketchbook 10: Ceremonial Art Research

With your table, you will be researching masks made by a particular culture and presenting your findings to the class. You may not use websites that are selling masks such as eBay or costume stores. Prepare at least 3 bullet points answering each question below.

- Where were the masks made? Give some geographical information about the region such as population, type of land, climate, etc. Your presentation must include an image of a map.
- Who were the people that made the masks? Give information about the culture/customs of the people from that area.
- Time period: (it must be at least 200 years ago!!!)
- Material used to make the mask and any connections (if applicable) to natural resources (wood, animal skin, bone, feathers, etc.) from the region.
- Characteristics of the masks (shape, size, colors, facial features, design, accessories...). Your presentation must include at least one drawn image.
- Significance/Purpose for use of the mask (ex. Worn in a ritual/ceremony, theatre/costume, hung to provide protection from evil, etc.
- Other important/interesting information.
- <u>Presentations (worth 20 pts)</u> Summarize the above information onto a large piece of paper and prepare a presentation for the class (approximately 3 minutes). Your presentation must include drawings of the masks you researched. <u>Suggested search terms:</u> Ancient Greek Masks, Venetian Masks, African Masks, Japanese Noh Masks, etc. In other words, be more specific than searching for "masks" or "pretty masks."

Sketchbook 11: Ceremonial Art-Present Day

Ceremonial art is art that is created to be used during a ceremony. What are ceremonies that we celebrate today in our own culture. Do a drawing of something that could be considered present day, American ceremonial art.






Sketchbook 12: Abstract Drawing

 Monochromatic means tints and shades of one color. Using your range a value and a color of your choice, do a monochromatic drawing.






Sketchbook 14: Artist Research Sheet


Sketchbook 15: Landscape in the Manor of your artist


